Delivery Info Sheet

- We will bring the shed into your yard with our truck & trailer, or with our EZ mover machine. Pictures of both are below:
- In order to get the shed into your yard, we must have the following:
 - A path everywhere we go -- from the street to where the shed will sit that is at least 24" wider than the shed. So, an 8'x14' wide shed requires a minimum 10' wide opening. A 10'x20' shed requires a 12' wide opening.
 - For larger sheds, we may require more clearance than 24". Particularly in instances where we will need to make turns or avoid objects. Deliveries in alleys also require more space to make the turn into your backyard.
 - Please remove fences, trim trees, etc to allow for proper access. Even small tree branches can cause damage to the shed.
 - Look out for low hanging trees, gutters, roof overhangs, etc. The roofline of the shed will be 10'-12' in the air, and is the most common part of shed that is damaged during delivery.
 - A relatively flat yard. The EZ Mover could tip over if the shed is walked across a sloped yard.
 - No large ruts, small retaining walls or anything else that may interfere with the wheels on the truck or EZ Mover.
 - Customers who live off alleys must make sure that there is acceptable clearance to get down the alley and access your yard. Damage to sheds that occurs in coming down an alley will not be our responsibility.
 - If your shed doors are on the side wall (Not the gable end), we must have plenty of space around the shed pad area to maneuver the Shed around.
